

Call for Papers

Special Issue on Artificial Intelligence and Policing

Nordic Journal of Studies in Policing

In this special issue we call for abstracts that consider possibilities, challenges and side-effects of artificial intelligence (AI) in policing. Policing in this context is to be understood in a broad sense, including inter alia, intelligence, criminal investigation and crime prevention.

Possible topics include, but are not limited to: Policing in smart cities, predictive policing, access to and use of big data, pattern recognition and crime analysis, intelligent robots (e.g. chatbots and driverless cars) in policing, AI ethics including regulation of policing and AI, possible consequences for trust and accountability, as well as methodological challenges related to performing research in this field of policing.

In order to further Nordic and international distribution, *all papers must be written in English*. Deadline for contributions will be **February 1st, 2020**, and interested authors are encouraged to submit abstracts as soon as possible and **no later than September 30th, 2019**. Authors will receive feedback about whether the abstract is accepted for submission of a full paper, shortly after the deadline.

Both individual and collaborative articles may be submitted, and Nordic research cooperation is especially encouraged.

Our time schedule is as follows:

- Deadline abstract: September 30th, 2019
- Deadline for submission full paper: February 1st, 2020
- Deadline final version: August 3rd, 2020
- Word limit: Between 3500 and 8000 words
